



New Construction Homes Coming to Slavic Village!

Slavic Village Development and the Cleveland Housing Network are pleased to announce that the Slavic Village Green Homes Project was recently awarded \$12 million in tax credits by the Ohio Housing Finance Agency (OHFA). These credits were the last piece of financing for the project which will build 37 single family homes in Slavic Village.

This innovative, high quality green project will feature 37 new construction homes built in close proximity to Fleet Avenue. All of the homes will have solar panels (which will reduce utility bills by 50%), high efficiency furnaces, and low flow toilets.



When complete, the homes will be available through a 15 year lease purchase program. At the end of 15 years, the homes will be sold at a discount to the tenants.

The Slavic Village Green Homes project compliments the efforts of the Slavic Village Recovery Project (SVR) to rehabilitate homes that can be saved and demolish those that are too far gone.

The Slavic Village Green Homes will fill in vacant lots with high quality, affordable homes. Together these projects are contributing to a comprehensive community revitalization strategy for the entire neighborhood.

Slavic Village Development CELEBRATED Slavic Village!

On a steamy August evening, Slavic Village Development “celebrated” Slavic Village at The Magalen, a new art gallery and studio space located on the beautifully reconstructed Fleet Avenue! Over 150 friends and supporters of SVD enjoyed appetizers served by Saucisson and Cleveland Central Catholic volunteers, live music by Jul Big Green, print making with Zygote Press, artwork by Rooms To Let artists, and desserts by Christy’s Custom Cakes.

SVD also honored three neighborhood partners that have made major investments in the community’s continuing comeback at the event. The 2016 “SV” Awards were awarded to Bob Tripodi from the City of Cleveland, Cleveland Housing Network, and the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District.

Pictured at right, Bob Tripodi, City of Cleveland Project Field Manager, received an SV for his oversight of the \$8.5 million Fleet Avenue Construction Project, the city’s first Complete and Green Street.

Over the past two years Bob has worked tirelessly to advocate for the concerns and needs of the residents and stakeholders of Fleet Avenue while also managing numerous contractors and project challenges. The results are an amazing new streetscape complete with bike lanes, beautiful landscaping, decorative seating, and innovative green infrastructure improvements.

The Cleveland Housing Network was chosen for this award based on its continued commitment to building quality, affordable housing in the Slavic Village neighborhood. Despite a highly competitive climate, CHN received \$12 million in Low-Income Housing Tax Credits for the Slavic Village Green Homes Project, which will begin construction in April 2016. The project includes a wraparound services component; demonstrating CHN’s desire to provide housing, while also enhancing the lives of the families who will reside in these homes.



The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District was chosen to receive the SV award based on the inventive green infrastructure projects that have been installed throughout the Broadway Slavic Village neighborhood.

These projects include several rain gardens and the entire Fleet Avenue Reconstruction project, along with upcoming collaborations, that will contribute to the health and vitality of the community for many years to come.

The SV awards were created by well-known Cleveland artist Dana Depew, who is also a participant in Rooms To Let:CLE, Slavic Village’s unique art installation in vacant homes. Mr. Depew used materials from the 2016 Rooms To Let homes to create the awards.

Road Construction Updates

The \$8 million nearly complete and green Fleet Avenue is now officially open to traffic in both directions! After two years of hard work the City of Cleveland and Karvo Construction have finished working on the roadway on Fleet Avenue. The street is nearly complete with striping for cars and bikes, new signage on street corners and telephone poles that identify the neighborhood, beautiful sandstone benches, brick herring bone and stone sidewalks, numerous tree pits, and landscaped areas that bump-out to define the finished concrete parking lanes.

Although the road is open to traffic two ways we still advise drivers to use caution as construction crews have some loose ends to button up. Remaining work includes the installation of more benches, trash cans, and bike racks, as well as finishing up the North East Ohio Regional Sewer District Green Infrastructure Retention Basin. Located at the corner of East 53rd and Fleet, this basin will be a park-like natural green space that will manage over 4 million gallons of storm water per year. The Cleveland Water Department along with Terrace Construction will soon be starting to work on a new water main going in on East 71st. This project will span from Broadway Avenue to Grant Avenue and will be divided into a series of work phases. The \$3 million dollar project will begin at Broadway and East 71st and work south towards Grant Avenue. Traffic will be maintained one-way northbound. Stay tuned to facebook.com/slavicvillage for project updates.

Work on the Pershing Avenue overpass over Interstate 77 in the city of Cleveland continues. This \$6 million project began in February 2015 and is estimated to be completed in the coming months. Crews have worked to replace the Pershing Avenue bridge over I-77 and have most of the decking complete. The I-77 northbound exit ramp at Pershing Avenue will remain closed thru fall 2016 until the project is complete.

Motorists are detoured via I-77 north, exit at Broadway Avenue and continue southbound to Pershing Avenue. Pershing Avenue entrance ramp to I-77 southbound is closed thru fall 2016. Motorists are detoured via Pershing eastbound to Broadway Avenue south to East 55th Street northbound to I-490 east to I-77 south. Traffic will be maintained on Pershing. Off-peak lane closures are expected on I-77. Visit www.dot.state.oh.us/ for project updates.

Village Market Concludes First Summer on Fleet



As the Village Market came to a close for the summer, the final Monday of the season capped off an exceptional first year on Fleet Ave. Along with the dozen regularly attending vendors, the final market took hold of the cookout theme, offering free Saucisson hotdogs and Seven Roses' delectable pierogis and potato pancakes.

Nearly 200 residents came out for the evening to enjoy the festivities celebrating what has been a revival for the farmers market in Slavic Village. Supplementing the food options, the E 63rd Street Block Club, in conjunction with the Lanskrone Foundation, handed out free gun locks as a part of the "Love a Kid, Lock a Gun" campaign. Adjacent to their tent, the Neighborhood Pet Resource Outreach Center won the hearts of animal lovers by distributing free dog treats and even doing face paintings.

Formerly located on Broadway, the new location, thanks to Sonny Day Development, on the corner of E 52nd and Fleet, brought a community presence to the reconstructed road. With westbound traffic blocked the entire season, the Village Market did face attendance challenges some Mondays but overall averaged nearly 100 visitors weekly.

The plethora of unique local vendors truly helped to give the market an identity. Among those, Slavic Village resident Christy Bartley, owner of Christy's Custom Cakes, added festive themes to her mix of treats such as her Cavaliers cake pops and RNC elephant cookies.

The fan favorite among women was likely fellow Slavic Villager Nic Abraham's company, Delicate Skin Essentials, whose hand-made lotions and body sprays were well received.

Despite being a neighborhood full of makers, what would a farmers market be without the produce? Community Greenhouse Partners was a staple for veggie shoppers, especially those looking for hard to find items like their assortment of microgreens.

For those looking to have a regular variety of fresh local fruits and vegetables, City Fresh made their shopping experience possible. The CSA (community supported agriculture) serves neighborhoods throughout Cleveland and even has subsidized options for lower income residents.

Though the market is complete for the summer, a holiday market is in the works to kick off the winter season this December. In its first year on Fleet Avenue, the Village Market thrived under the road conditions and summer heat, eyeing improvements for an optimistic outlook on what Clevelanders know all too well as "next year."

Note: The Village Market is now closed, but City Fresh will be operating in the same location every Monday through October 24th.

The City of Cleveland's Community Development Department provides the excellent Storefront Renovation Program. This program assists targeted neighborhood retail districts in becoming attractive, economically viable, and diverse places to shop.

The program helps fund the rehabilitation/renovation of primarily traditional storefront building exteriors. Applicants are eligible to receive a rebate of 40% of project cost not to exceed a maximum rebate of \$25,000. There is also low interest loan programs available.

City of Cleveland Resource Directory

ANIMALS

Who can I contact about stray dogs?

Division of Animal Control at 216-664-3069 from 7:30am to 3pm Monday thru Saturday. After hours, call police at 216-621-1234.

Who can I call about animal abuse or neglect?

The Animal Protective League at 216-771-4616 has Cruelty Investigators that investigate complaints.

What can I do about a barking dog in the City of Cleveland?

Call 216-664-3069 with the dog owner's address. An Animal Control Officer will respond and issue a written notice of complaint. This phone is answered Monday through Saturday from 7:30am to 3pm. An answering machine records after-hours calls.

Does the City of Cleveland have a service that traps nuisance wildlife? Who do I contact?

Call the Division of Animal Control at 216-664-3069. Leave your name, address, zip code, phone number, and type of nuisance animal. You can use your own trap and Animal Control will pick it up, you can borrow a trap for a \$20 returnable deposit, or the animal can be put on the list for a contracted wildlife trapper.

CITY PROPERTY

Who can I call about damaged playground equipment?

Call 216-664-8300 to report the damage to the Division of Park Maintenance & Properties.

How do I get a water fountain repaired in my park or playground?

If equipment or structures require repair, call the Division of Park Maintenance at 216-348-8300.

What number should I call regarding park equipment that needs to be repaired?

Call the Division of Park Maintenance at 216-420-8300.

GRAFFITI REMOVAL

Call the Graffiti Removal Program at 216-661-2510 on weekdays from 7am to 3:30pm to remove graffiti on city-owned buildings, roads, guardrails, bridges and docks.

PEOPLE

Who do I contact about loud music coming from cars or homes?

Offensively loud music is against the law. Police may warn or cite the offenders, and may confiscate the equipment. You can call police at 216-621-1234.

Where do I call to report a suspected drug house?

Call your local police station and ask for the Commander's Office or the Vice Unit or call the Mayor's Action Line at 216-664-2900. You do not have to leave your name and number. Please have as much information as possible including the address, time/day of most activity and where transactions are being made (side door, alley, etc.) If there is a crime in progress, report it to 911.

My neighbor's car has been parked on the street and has not been moved in a month. Is there anything I can do about this?

You may call your local police district and inform them of the situation. Your neighbor cannot park his vehicle on the street longer than three days without moving it.

ILLEGAL DUMPING

Call the City of Cleveland's Illegal Dumping and Special Services Hotline at 216-664-3867 on weekdays from 8am to 5pm. Contractors, haulers and individuals dump tons of debris and hazardous waste in vacant lots, abandoned homes, roadsides and alleys. The city has a list of steps individuals may take to protect their health and environment and perhaps earn a monetary reward if the suspect is convicted.

PROPERTIES

Does the city provide free wood chips to residents?

Yes, upon request. Call 216-664-3104 for up to 6 yards of wood chips. They will be delivered free of charge to any City of Cleveland resident in 5 to 7 business days. The City does not store wood chips to pick up.

There is a tree on my tree lawn that needs trimming. Does the City take care of that?

Yes, call the Division of Urban Forestry at 216-664-3235 and a City employee will come out and inspect the tree. If the tree requires trimming, it will be placed on a list for service.

How do I get a City-owned tree removed?

Property owners concerned about a city-owned tree that may be dead, diseased or hazardous may contact the office of Urban Forestry at 216-664-3235.

Tree roots from the tree on my tree lawn are raising my sidewalk. Will the city remove the roots?

Yes, the city will grind out the roots. The homeowner is responsible for lifting the sidewalk. For further information on tree root removal call 216-664-3104.

Who is responsible for grass cutting on vacant lots?

The city has land bank properties which the Division of Park Maintenance and Properties is responsible for maintaining. The Cuyahoga County Land Bank also has some vacant properties that it is responsible for maintaining. Many vacant lots are privately owned, and property owners should maintain them. If grass on a lot is over 8" the City will cut it and bill the owner.

Who can I call about a vacant property that has not been maintained?

Call the Division of Park Maintenance and Properties at 216-420-8300.

STREETS

What should I do if I see a fire hydrant open?

Call the Fire Dispatch Center non-emergency number at 216-664-6350.

There is a broken water main on my street, who do I call?

Call the Division of Water at 216-664-2444.

There is a broken water main on my street, who do I call?

Call the Division of Water at 216-664-2444.

Our street is flooding because of a blocked storm drain. What should I do?

Contact Water Pollution Control at 216-664-2513.

I need to request a street sweeping. What should I do?

The Division of Streets sweeps each main street every 10 days from May to October. Each residential street is swept every four weeks. If you believe there is an additional need for a street to be swept, call 216-664-2510.

I believe our street needs resurfacing. Who do I call at the City?

Call the Division of Streets operation center at 216-664-2510. Your street will be inspected, and if it needs resurfacing, it will be put on a list. The streets needing the most work receive higher priority and are completed first.

What number do I call to get my street plowed and salted?

Call the Division of Streets at 216-664-2510. When snowfall reaches at least one half inch, the Division of Streets begins plowing and salting main streets. Clearing of residential streets is determined by weather conditions and forecasts, with salting for accumulation less than two inches and a combination of salting and plowing for accumulation over 2 inches.

On Saturday, October 22nd at 11:00 a.m., Slavic Village Development will partner with the McGregor Foundation and its PACE program to present a home repair workshop for residents of the greater Broadway-Slavic Village community.

The workshop will take place at Neighborhood Housing Services office, 5700 Broadway Avenue, with support from the Cleveland Housing Network and the City of Cleveland. Workshop presentations will encourage residents to think seriously about winter home preparation. 
